# Founders Pennies FAQ

Each year, Soroptimist clubs make Founders Pennies donations to celebrate the founding of our organization and support its global Dream Programs. Founders Pennies are a classic, time-honored tradition for clubs, and a creative way to help fund life changing programs. Founders Pennies help create a local and global relationship between Soroptimist clubs and members, and the women and girls who need our support.

### How are Founders Pennies used?

Founders Pennies are used to fund the Live Your Dream Awards, Dream It, Be It, and other SIA programs that improve the lives of women and girls in local communities and throughout the world. Founders Pennies represent approximately 10 percent of the total \$1.7 million contributed to fund federation programs.

### How are Founders Pennies calculated?

Founders Pennies are set at \$.06 per member times the number of years that SIA has been in existence (1921). For the 2020-2021 club year, \$.06 x 100 years = \$6.00 per member.

### Who gives Founders Pennies?

Founders Pennies are remitted to headquarters by each participating club. Clubs collect the pennies from their members in a variety of ways and usually submit them with club dues.

## When did the tradition of Founders Pennies begin?

The tradition of giving pennies began in 1943. Clubs collected one penny for each year of Soroptimist's existence and used the money to help re-establish clubs in Europe that had disbanded as a result of pre-World War II political conditions and the war itself. In 1946 the fund was renamed the Founders Fund. This fund provided international fellowships, scholarships and other awards to improve the status of women. Beginning in the 1960s, Founders Pennies began funding for the Youth Citizenship Awards, and now the Live Your Dream Awards.

### Are Founders Pennies mandatory?

Founders Pennies are a voluntary contribution from Soroptimist members remitted to headquarters by clubs. As with all contributions, Founders Pennies are not mandatory. (SIA)



### HAPPY 70<sup>th</sup> BIRTHDAY SOROPTIMIST INTERNATIONAL OF LA MESA!!!

You are looking great for all those years of fundraising and service! Our mission is "To improve the lives of women and girls through programs leading to social and economic empowerment." That is what SI La Mesa has done for the past 70 years and will continue to do in the future!

We have performed many service projects over the years. Here is a sample of some those service projects:

We advocated for Pre-Natal Care for mothers on MediCal. A bill was finally passed by the State legislature to pay doctors for treating pre-natal MediCal women.

Involvement Free Enterprise "IFE" was a joint project we did with the Kiwanis club for a number of years. It was a week-end event up at the Boy Scout camp in Julian. High School juniors participated in discussions on economics, free enterprise etc.

Destination Women 2000 was a project we participated in for about 5 years. It was a self-esteem one day conference for women from low income families who needed help with job interview skills, self-esteem building, legal assistance etc. This project won 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the SIA Celebrating Success awards! In 2014 we sponsored the Women's Opportunity Conference which was a follow up of our successful Destination Women 2000 project. This one day conference provides information, resources and support for women in transition. It was very successful and SI La Mesa again was awarded 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the SIA Celebrating Success awards as well as a \$4,000 SIA Woman's Grant!!

Rachel's Women's Center for homeless women is a hands on project that we have done for a number of years. Every month or so we serve a delicious home cooked dinner to the women.

The SILM Service Brigade has assisted many non-profits with their service and fundraising projects.

Naval Consolidated Brig was a mentoring project along with a book club we participate in for incarcerated women.

We have assisted young women who have been victims of human trafficking and who are participants in the STARS program.

Although the pandemic has limited our actions, we continue to donate funds for many worth causes and will be back in person to continue our mission as soon as possible.
